Farmers face risk daily—Risk Management Education helps farmers manage those risks to increase profitability.

Extension Risk Management Education, or **ERME**, is a regionally based, federally funded program. ERME provides competitive grants that fund education projects focused on helping farmers and ranchers successfully manage the unique risks associated with production agriculture.

ERME funds education projects in 5 Risk Areas

- 1. Production Risk
- 2. Marketing Risk
- 3. Financial Risk
- 4. Legal Risk
- 5. Human Risk

ERME-funded projects generate tangible results

Production Risk

17,488 Farmers implemented new production systems or technologies.

Marketing Risk

32,148 Farmers implemented a marketing plan to take advantage of pricing opportunities.

Financial Risk

24,936 Farmers developed a business plan to help their farm business be more successful.

Legal Risk

7,272 Farmers implemented a food security plan to assure they are providing a quality product.

Human Risk

9,743 Farmers developed a transition plan to help keep the next generation on the farm.
